State of Queensland v Tafao & Ors; Serco Australia Pty Ltd & Anor v Tafao & Anor [2021] QCA 74 – successfully obtained an indemnity certificate pursuant to the Appeal Costs Fund Act 1973

State of Queensland v Tafao & Ors; Serco Australia Pty Ltd & Anor v Tafao & Anor [2021] QCA 56 – discrimination; acting for the respondent to appeals by the State and Serco against a woman who had been misgendered when detained as a prisoner – unsuccessfully defended the appeals
